

The Process of Illumination:
“If the light that is in you is darkness,
how great is that darkness.”
1 Corinthians 2:10-16

Introduction:

1. The Spirit imparts God's wisdom to the believer
 - a. The Spirit inquires (seeks to discover) everything about God's will and ways.
 - b. The Spirit who knows God's heart, reveals the things given to us
2. The (one ministering) minister imparts God's wisdom from the Spirit 13
 - a. Divine origin of the teaching
 - b. Divine reception of what is taught 13b

3. The ministeer receives God's wisdom through the Spirit 14-16

- a. The natural person cannot receive it
- b. The spiritual person is able to discern it
- c. The spiritual person is judged/discerned by no one
 - i. Example:
 - 1. Stephen Hawking: Religion is a fairytale for people afraid of the _____.
 - 2. John Lennox: _____ is a fairytale for people afraid of the _____.
 - ii. A natural person is unable to grasp the mind of the Lord.
 - iii. We have the mind of Christ--we can judge all things (freely given to us by God).
